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St Brigid's Primary School Uniform Guideline Booklet.

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SCHOOL UNIFORMS

It is compulsory for all students at St Brigid's Primary School to wear the correct uniform at all times according to our uniform code.

All students in Year One to Year Six are required to wear the school uniform as specified below. A note of explanation is required if the correct uniform is not being worn. All items of clothing are to be clearly marked with the student's full name to ensure all property is returned to them if misplaced.

We expect the support of parents/carers in ensuring that this uniform code is adhered to at all times and any queries or concerns are addressed promptly.

KINDERGARTEN AND PRE PRIMARY

There is no compulsory school uniform for Kindergarten students however there is a school Kindergarten t-shirt available and which can be worn with the St Brigid's sports shorts and school hat.

As Pre Primary is compulsory, students are required to wear Sport Uniform.

FEMALE STUDENTS

As part of our uniform code it is expected that the length of the uniform worn by our female students is to be knee length. We ask that parents/carers look closely at the length of the uniforms and if they find them to be above the knee, that they are altered or replaced as soon as possible. Most of the dresses and skirts have large hems to allow for growth and can be altered as growth occurs.

Summer:

(Term 1 & 4)

- Blue dress with school logo.
- Blue school jumper with school logo.
- White ankle socks with yellow & blue stripes.
- Black lace-up shoes or Brown buckled sandals (with no socks).



Winter:

(Term 2 & 3)

- School blue Tie.
- Blue tartan pleated skirt.
- Blue school blue buttoned shirt with logo.
- Blue School jumper with school logo.
- White ankle socks with yellow & blue stripes.
- Black lace-up school shoes.



MALE STUDENTS

The formal uniform for boys i.e. pale blue shirt, is to be worn tucked-in to both shorts in summer and trousers in winter. Please check that your child's shirt has adequate length to be tucked in.

Summer:

(Term 1 & 4)

- Grey school style shorts or pants (no oversized or cargo styles).
- Blue school blue buttoned shirt with logo.
- Grey ankle socks with royal blue stripe.
- Black lace-up shoes or Brown buckled sandals (with no socks).



Winter:

(Term 2 & 3)

- School blue Tie.
- Grey school style shorts or pants (no oversized or cargo styles).
- Blue school blue buttoned shirt with logo.
- Blue School jumper with school logo.
- Grey ankle socks with royal blue stripe.
- Black lace-up shoes



SCHOOL SPORTS UNIFORMS

MALE AND FEMALE STUDENTS

At the beginning of the school term students will be advised by their classroom teacher two specified days when year groups have Physical Education classes, on these days they are to wear the sports uniform. Once a week students are to wear the faction coloured shirts and the other day are to wear the school polo blue and white sport shirts. When cold, students may elect to wear the school track suit.



Summer & Winter:

- School Polo or Faction Polo top.
- Royal blue unisex shorts screen printed with the words " St Brigid's Primary" in white or St Brigid's Tracksuit pants- royal blue with white logo.
- White socks blue stripe and the words "St Brigid's Primary".
- All Black, all white or a combination of black and white sandshoes. (coloured laces or fluoro shoes are not permitted)



The tracksuit top should only be worn on sports days and not in place of the school jumper in winter.

FACTIONS

Factions are allocated to each student on their first day of school and they will be The School Factions are Francis (Green), Joseph (Gold), Mackillop (Red) and Mercy (Blue).



Francis (Green) Is the Order of Friars who ministered the Midland Parish for many years during the early development of St Brigid's School. The Franciscan Friars had a deep and long term affiliation with our School.

Joseph (Gold) The Sisters of Saint Joseph commonly referred to as the "Brown Joeys" because of their brown coloured "habits" taught and worked at St Brigid's for over 30 year, from 1970 to 2000. This is the Order of Sisters founded by Mary MacKillop.

Mackillop (Red) Mary MacKillop was the Foundress of the Sisters of Saint Joseph in 1867. As a result of her pioneering spirit in providing education, especially for the poor, she has become Australia's first Saint in 2010, St Mary of the Cross.

Mercy (Blue) after the Sisters of Mercy whom were Administrators and teachers of St Brigid's for 70 years starting in 1902.

SCHOOL BAGS AND HATS

The St Brigid's School bag is compulsory for all students from Pre Primary to Year Six students. A number of school bags have student's names embroidered on them. While this looks great and makes the bag easily identified, this practice can cause issues in relation to "stranger danger" if a child can be easily identified by the name on their school bag. We suggest to assist in the bags being able to be identified personal key chains and ribbons can be used.

During all terms, wearing of the St Brigid's school hat is compulsory. As we are a 'Sun Smart School' students are required to wear a St Brigid's wide brimmed hat when outdoors throughout the entire year. We enforce a 'no hat, no play' policy.



HAIR, GROOMING AND JEWELLERY.

Students are to be responsible for their own appearance and it would be appreciated if students could have clean and polished shoes, shirts tucked in, as well as careful grooming and brushing of hair.

Hair must be clean, neat and tidy. Students must have their hair styled or restrained so that it does not fall onto the face.

Make-up or nail polish is not acceptable at school. These will be removed if worn to school.

Hair for girls should be:

- Clean, neat and tidy.
- Girls' long hair (collar length and longer) should be tied back firmly away from the face.
- Fringe must be short and well above the brows.
- Hair accessories must be plain, non-decorative and only in the following colours – royal blue, white or black.
- On faction carnival days students may wear ribbons that match the colour of their faction.

Hair for boys should be:

- Clean, neat and tidy.
- Boys' hair is to be short back & sides; hair must be well above the collar and not over the ears.
- Fringe must be short and well above the brows.
- Long hair (collar length and longer) should be tied back firmly away from the face.

The below styles are not permitted for students at St Brigid's, if a child attends school with the below they will be asked to return home and change hair to follow school guideline:

- Long sweeping fringes
- Mohawks, Razor cuts and Rats Tails
- Unnatural, Coloured or dyed hair.
- Extreme hairstyles and Spiky hair.

JEWELLERY

Studs or sleepers may be worn if both ears have been pierced, with one stud or sleeper is to be placed in each earlobe. Ear piercing should be done during school holidays so earrings can be removed when school resumes.

The ONLY other acceptable jewellery is chains with crosses or holy medallions (to be worn under the school shirt), wristwatch or a Medic Alert bracelet (the only bracelet permitted). Please see examples bellow.
